At Oak Hill Academy, we are using the Catch up grant to provide early morning and / or after school academic learning sessions for those pupils in our school who are identified as being in need of further support and intervention. This provision is additional to the afternoon interventions that take place in the afternoons sessions during the school day. Year 6 children all attend these sessions.
