



Curriculum Overview

Welcome back to the final term at Oak Hill! Our No Limits assignment this half-term is **'All The World's A Stage'**, underpinned by the Aspirations focus: **'Fun and Excitement'**. As part of the topic, children will become Directors of London's famous Globe Theatre.

This topic will include: English, Maths, Science, History, Art, D&T, Drama, Computing, Wellness and PE. The children will also be continuing with Specialism days every other week where they will take part in Wellness, Spanish, Music and PE.
